REGIONAL LOCATION

- 1,600 acre property
- ~8 miles west of Modesto
- Confluence of Tuolumne and San Joaquin Rivers




PARK HISTORY

- 2002 Tuolumne River Trust launches outreach with landowners along the Tuolumne River for a conservation project.
- 2003 California State Parks launches Central Valley Vision
- 2004 Lyons family (previous owners) express support to sell ranch
- 2006 River Partners and Tuolumne River Trust prepare restoration plan
- 2009 California State Parks identifies Dos Rios as high priority State Park
- 2012 River Partners and Tuolumne River Trust purchase property
- 2023 Restoration of 1,600 acres, along 8 miles of the San Joaquin and Tuolumne rivers
- 2024 California State Parks opens Dos Rios


CALIFORNIA NATIVE AMERICANS

- Tribes in the Dos Rios region
- Tribal Consultation
- 3-acre Native Use Garden
 - » Planted for Indigenous basketry and other cultural uses











HISTORIC WAY OF LIFE

- Land used by indigenous tribes before European exploration
- Part of Alta California
 - » 35,466-acre Rancho Pescadero Land Grant (1843)
- Farming and Agriculture
 - » Dos Rios Ranch (1930's)
 - » Barn, silos, dairy barn, pole barns
- Leisure-uses throughout history
 - » Fishing and canoeing
 - » Latino and Indigenous cultures






Recreational Opportunities

EXAMPLE VISION

Vision Statement

"Big Basin Redwoods State Park endures as one of California's most iconic natural landscapes. In the aftermath of the CZU Lightning Complex Fire that burned much of the park and destroyed nearly all facilities, the long-standing commitment to protecting old growth and stewarding natural lands will be reinvigorated. Park stewardship, based on scientific and Indigenous knowledge, will foster forest health and create opportunities to connect visitors of all backgrounds and abilities with redwood forests for generations to come...."


